

Phones, email and Personal cars

Email

The pen tablet PC computers each student will use for mapping has a wireless receiver built in and a wireless keyboard. email can be done in the bunkhouse using either wireless in each bunk room from signals from the Linksys router or a Ethernet port in the bunkhouse accessible by students in the evening.

Policy for Internet Use

With a single country DSL line, there are practical limitations on use as the speed of transmission of downloading and uploading information from the internet varies with use. The policies below will help students who wish to use the internet to do so with a minimum of wasted time.

- (1) Briefly check your email, down load files and log off.
- (2) Compose your emails **off-line** as time allows with the wireless switch on the pen tablet in your care turned off.
- (3) When it is **your turn in the sign-up order** for **on-line** internet use each day log on onto the system after turning the wireless switch on.
- (4) As soon as you are done using the Internet on-line, then inform the next person on the list so there is no unnecessary gap in usage so nobody has to wait up late to send and receive their emails.

Phone service

No cell phone service is available in Wise River. However, there is a pay phone at the local Mercantile Store.

Head phones

Since it is important to stay aware of your surroundings in the field for the sake of safety and communications with your mapping partner and others in our group by radio, headphones are not to be used during working hours.

Personal cars
